What is more strange is the fact that those who take part in the voting ritual of this festival have been doing so for many years and have seen the results each time to be that the "Crooks and Liars" do very well, but they themselves remain, relatively poor and insecure and their environment keeps going down hill, yet they persist in participating believing that somehow the next bunch of "Crook and Liars" will not actually be crooks and liars.

Perhaps those "voters" should start to organise among themselves to take control of their own lives and communities and try to shape them the way that they would like in co-operation with others and leave the ridiculous show of insanity that is the "Festival of Crooks and Liars" for what it is, a dangerous illusion, a disempowerment that allows our wealth to be siphoned upwards.





As our unloved politicians gallop maniacally around the land seeking enhancing photo-opportunities and vomiting meaningless sound bites, it tells you all you need to know about our political system. It is all show and appearances, it is a personality contest, wives included. They call it democracy, I call it theatre. It is baffling how in a country that has been fighting an illegal war in Afghanistan for the last nine years can run up to an election and not one of the main parties mentions the war. Is this a coincidence or is it a pre-arranged set up by the leaders of these little political cabals to make their jabberings all on the narrowest of topics where they can speak volumes but say nothing that is related to reality.

Imagine living in a land where the system allows you real influence and real choice. POLITICS OF THE PEOPLE.

The Glasgow rent strikes of 1915-26, women's suffrage, the labour battles of the 20s & 30s, the American civil rights movement, the anti-Vietnam war protests, the Upper Clyde Shipyard work-in, the British anti-poll tax protests and there are many, many more. All these movements were successful because of the people on the streets, people taking direct action. All these movements were at first opposed by the major sections of the party political system. The social changes these movements created didn't happen because people politely and meekly waited for the major parties to respond, they happened because the people igcruel illusion, a cage of exploitation, a rich parasites para- nored the party political system and forced the implementation of their demands.
